Edward Mogg (fl.1803-1860) was a cartographer, engraver, and publisher, active in London at the

beginning of the nineteenth century. Rather unusually for the time he not only drew his own maps, but also engraved them. The business was mainly based upon the production of pocket travel guides and maps.
